Operating around the globe to save many of the world's most iconic species, ZSL works in the front-line of wildlife conservation, with projects ranging from alleviating human-elephant conflict in Thailand to protecting both Sumatran tigers and carbon-rich peat forests in Indonesia.

ZSL works in Thailand with the Elephant Conservation Network (ECN) to help encourage a peaceful co-existence between elephants and humans. They work closely with government agencies and local communities to help reduce human-elephant conflict and improve protection of the conservation areas. This generous gift will allow ZSL to further develop conservation projects to save these animals and more around the world.

Donations to the gift fund can be made through the website www.royalweddingcharityfund.org and grants will be distributed by the Foundation of Prince William and Prince Harry.

The Elephant Conservation Network (ECN) was founded in 2005 and is a non-profit organisation whose aim is to conserve wild elephants and their habitat. ECN uses a collaborative, research-based approach to plan and implement sustainable solutions to human-elephant conflict in and around the Salakpra Wildlife Sanctuary and Chalerm Rattanakosin National Park in Kanchanaburi province. Working closely with local communities, the Department of National Parks, Plant and Wildlife Conservation, and other government and non-government agencies, ECN is currently implementing a variety of projects, including:

- Monitoring human-elephant conflict around Salakpra
- Supporting the development of a Smart Patrol System in Salakpra
- Helping to establish conservation corridors between Salakpra and WEFCOM
- Facilitating alternative livelihood enterprises for forest-users around Salakpra
- Assisting the creation and management of an elephant electric fence around Salakpra
